**PC713VxNSZXF Series** contains an IRED optically coupled to a phototransistor.

It is packaged in a 6 pin DIP, available in SMT gullwing lead-form option.

Input-output isolation voltage(rms) is 5.0kV.

Collector-emitter voltage is 80V and CTR is 50% to 600% at input current of 5mA.




#### ■ Internal Connection Diagram









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Fig.1 Forward Current vs. Ambient Temperature




Fig.3 Collector Power Dissipation vs.

Ambient Temperature




Fig.5 Peak Forward Current vs. Duty Ratio




Fig.2 Diode Power Dissipation vs. Ambient Temperature




Fig.4 Total Power Dissipation vs. Ambient Temperature




Fig.6 Forward Current vs. Forward Voltage






Fig.7 Current Transfer Ratio vs. Forward Current




Fig.9 Relative Current Transfer Ratio vs.
Ambient Temperature




Fig.11 Collector Dark Current vs. Ambient Temperature




Fig.8 Collector Current vs. Collectoremitter Voltage




Fig.10 Collector - emitter Saturation Voltage vs. Ambient Temperature




Fig.12 Collector-base Dark Current vs.
Ambient Temperature






Fig.13 Response Time vs. Load Resistance




Fig.15 Frequency Response






Fig.14 Test Circuit for Response Time

#### Design guide

While operating at I<sub>F</sub><1.0mA, CTR variation may increase.

Please make design considering this fact.


This product is not designed against irradiation and incorporates non-coherent IRED.

# ● Degradation

In general, the emission of the IRED used in photocouplers will degrade over time.

In the case of long term operation, please take the general IRED degradation (50% degradation over 5 years) into the design consideration.

#### ■ Manufacturing Guidelines


#### Soldering Method

#### Reflow Soldering:

Reflow soldering should follow the temperature profile shown below.

Soldering should not exceed the curve of temperature profile and time.

Please don't solder more than twice.



#### Flow Soldering:

Due to SHARP's double transfer mold construction submersion in flow solder bath is allowed under the below listed guidelines.

Flow soldering should be completed below 270°C and within 10s.

Preheating is within the bounds of 100 to 150°C and 30 to 80s.

Please don't solder more than twice.

#### Hand soldering

Hand soldering should be completed within 3s when the point of solder iron is below 400°C.

Please don't solder more than twice.

#### Other notices

Please test the soldering method in actual condition and make sure the soldering works fine, since the impact on the junction between the device and PCB varies depending on the tooling and soldering conditions.



#### Cleaning instructions

Solvent cleaning:

Solvent temperature should be 45°C or below Immersion time should be 3 minutes or less

#### Ultrasonic cleaning:

The impact on the device varies depending on the size of the cleaning bath, ultrasonic output, cleaning time, size of PCB and mounting method of the device.

Therefore, please make sure the device withstands the ultrasonic cleaning in actual conditions in advance of mass production.

#### Recommended solvent materials:

Ethyl alcohol, Methyl alcohol and Isopropyl alcohol

In case the other type of solvent materials are intended to be used, please make sure they work fine in actual using conditions since some materials may erode the packaging resin. WWW.100Y.COM.

#### Presence of ODC

This product shall not contain the following materials.







Carrier tape structure and Dimensions




